

To the landholder

A live fire shooting range has been proposed / is operating on land which is located near your property.

Land which is owned by you is deemed to be within the range danger area and ‘permissive shooting rights’ must be provided by each landholder to approve range use.

The range danger area includes those areas of land or water, together with a specified air space, within which danger to life, limb or property may occur arising from the firing of specified ammunition.

‘Permissive shooting rights’ is written permission, provided by the legal owner of the land or other person legally authorised to give this permission, for range personnel to have access to and conduct activities relating to the use of the shooting range.

This document outlines the ‘permissive shooting rights’ which are required to be understood and agreed on by you, as the person legally able to give such permission, prior to consideration being given by the Firearms Registry to approval of the shooting range by the Commissioner of Police.

- ✓ Projectiles may encroach on land owned by you
- ✓ Range officials may need to patrol the boundaries of the range danger area prior to commencement of shooting events or competitions to ensure that the range danger area is clear.
- ✓ Range officials may need to erect signs on property owned by you in the range danger area.
- ✓ Range officials may need to erect flags on land owned by you.
- ✓ You may wish to request restrictions on the times and day shooting may occur.

NOTE: Permission may be withheld or withdrawn at any time by the landholder by providing notification in writing to the Range Inspector, Firearms Registry.
