Discussion Item

Overview of Community Safety Precinct Committee meetings and how they will be run by Commander Robinson. CPSC's will be chaired by either Local Area Commander or delegated Duty Officer, Minutes made available through NSW Police website. Not a forum to talk about individual issues. CPSC's will be held quarterly.

Commander Robinson discussed the reason why each town now has its individual town meetings. With each community having its own individuality and what affects one town may not be relevant to another town. Each town will now have its own meeting and reports to be shown.

Commander Robinson discussed the advertising of positions for new police to town. The requirement to have them come to the town have a look and checks will be done to see if they are suitable to the positions before they will be offered the position. This new systems seems to be working at other towns and that people who want to work, live and be part of the outback towns will be attracted to fill all positions advertised.

Introduction of Darling River Local Area Commands Crime Prevention Officer (CPO) Senior Constable Debbie Moore. Overview on her role to assist the Community and help implement strategies to reduce crime. Discussions on how Debbie can help the town. As Crime Prevention Officer how she can assist the community to introduce Crime Prevention Strategies into the Brewarrina township. How she can work with external agencies, assist shops with safety audits, Working with the elderly and how to make them safe.

Overview of the a couple individuals committing most of the offences within the Brewarrina township. Discussion topic about why a couple of young persons are committing most the community. What happens to the young person when in custody

Discussion on the same young persons stealing a car and the car being written off, concerns were raised that this young person may kill herself if not stopped. Compensation for the car that was written off was also discussed.

The police can often tell who is committing the crimes by who is released and back in the community. We should all be working to 3 outcomes

- 1 Stop what they are doing
- 2 Get them to leave town
- 3 Or be arrested

Comments' regarding the Liquor Accord in Brewarrina seems to be working Domestic Violence is down and the town looks a lot better.

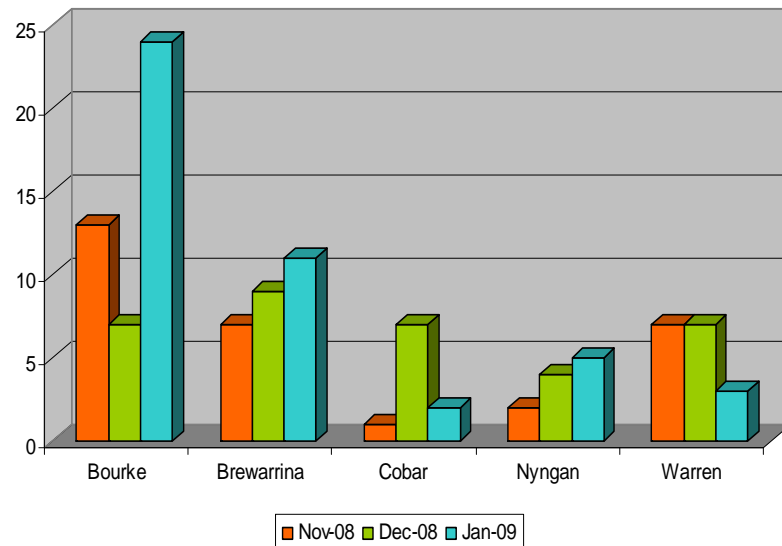
