Overview of statistical data by Inspector Luke Rankin, Crime Manager for Cobar Shire Council in comparison with other Darling River LGAs.

Discussion Item

- Senior Constable Debbie Moore, Crime Prevention Officer briefed the group in relation to the recent Cobar Town audit that took place in January, 2011. A full report was compiled and sent to Cobar Shire council (Gary Woodman) for reference
- Gary Woodman discussed the Crime Prevention Plan for Cobar Shire Council. He has recently spoken to the Attorney General's Dept about the progress of the plan. The attorney generals dept has asked council to reduce the categories contained within the plan to 1 or 2 priority areas. The crime prevention plan assists in obtaining grants for councils. All of the information contained within the plan came from 4 years of meetings and working of the priority areas. There is good support from all agencies involved in the process.
- Gary also discussed the results of the recent town audit.
- New education DV agency opening in Cobar on 10.3.2011. Sgt Woolfe explained that when they attend domestic violence incidents they offer the victim referrals and

get the Domestic Violence Liaison Officer to provide support.

- *Mayor Brady said that the local police are working very hard and pleased with their efforts. She also mentioned that she see's them patrolling at night. Mayor Brady also addressed the local liquor accord committee*
- *Cobar races to be held on May 14th. The racing committee are working with local police and the liquor accord to make sure everything goes smoothly.*
