ITEM 3 Development of Matrix

3 points nominated by Rangers as key matters required to be addressed within Cheat Sheets/Matrix:

- 1- Hours of operation
- 2- Closure of certain areas at specified times
- 3- Prohibition of amplified music in certain areas.

All members agreed on the first 6 premises to create Draft Generic Matrix then add site specific conditions. Trial and test to create a central resource then report back.

- 1- Shore Club
- 2- Henry Afrikas
- 3- The Steyne
- 4- The Ivanhoe
- 5- New Brighton
- 6- Manly Pacific

Specific top 5 conditions from Police point of view to be obtained this week for each of the abovementioned premises. Supt Dave Darcy noted that there are no issues with security guards at present apart from enforcing 'Protection of the Crime Scene' and 'Clean up of the Crime Scene' during incidents of assaults.

Issue raised by Councillor Hugh Burns regarding the availability of either all conditions or specific conditions to the public. Decision made that most effective option with minimal impact on resources for Rangers and to minimise the encouragement of complaints would be to have complete DA available.

Action to be taken:

- 1- Gather list
- 2- Write to clubs attaching DA list nominating relevant conditions.
- 3- Officers to enforce conditions.
- 4- Council to investigate complaints as they arise.

Issue of checking numbers in venues too difficult to monitor. Tony Pavlovic raised the point that the Fire Brigade has completed audits and will follow up and issue notices where necessary.

Superintendent Dave Darcy informed members that he has met with Professor Challa Subhash and IT Manager Cory Sharplin and approval has been granted for the positioning of a camera over the entrance door of the Shore Club to count numbers. The camera is not yet in place.
