LAST MEETING MONDAY 26 FEBRUARY 2007

The meeting on Monday 26 February opened at 8:05pm in the lounge area. Coffee, tea, and biscuits were available. 11 people including the committee attended.

MINUTES:

Minutes for the previous meeting were distributed at the meeting. Acceptance of the minutes was proposed by Albert Browne and seconded by Nan Young.

PRESENTATION - CHRIS PERRY - HORNSBY KU-RING-GAI PCYC

Chris Perry spoke about the history of PCYCs and future plans for the Hornsby Ku-ring-gai Police & Citizens Youth Club. The clubs started in the 1930s initially to help boys during the depression. The clubs expanded their operations to include girls after World War 2. During the 1970s the clubs started offering team sports and blue light discos. Most Police became involved as part of their career and some became full-time workers.

Nowadays the PCYCs in NSW are self-funded and early this millennium the State Government employed private managers to improve the clubs. During Chris's term so far the Hornsby PCYC has reduced its debt considerably and expanded its range of activities and utilisation of its premises.

Hornsby PCYC is now looking for improved premises and has embarked on an ambitious plan to build a new centre on part of the land used by the Hornsby Bowling Club in Edgeworth David Road. The presentation to our meeting included drawings of the proposed centre and a computer-generated "tour" of the proposed facilities.

The NSW Police will encourage committees to set up in towns and cities throughout NSW and ask them to identify the crime and safety issues they believe are important to their area.
