### Discussion Item

- Discussion by SGT WOOD in relation to staffing and the new arrival of staff
- There will be a police operation during the Easter long weekend in relation to rural crime, stock theft. (southern sectors)
- The school principal (Chad Bliss) was asked if he has noticed any drugs in schools. He stated he has not had any reports in relation to drugs; however he has had reports in relation to drinking of alcohol by year 10 students. This has been referred to the Child Wellbeing Unit. It was suggested that we look at guest speakers to speak to the school kids in relation to these issues
- Driver training for youth discussed. Suggested that parents also need a refresher course in driving if they are going to teach their children. The school principal asked if there was a vehicle available from the school to use, he stated there was however would have to look into it further. Suggestions made to see if there were any road safety programs that are currently available. Possibly look at a presentation for school students and parents (from crash investigation). Enquire with S/Cst Franklin
- Smoking cigarettes in schools is a big issue at present. Several kids currently suspended this term. Possibly look at getting information from the cancer council
- Violence and graffiti in schools. How is it dealt with? Sgt Wood has spoken to several parents. 1 Violent incident this term. Two children on suspension at present. It is a possibility that these children are following their parent's behaviour.
- Graffiti in school have increased (school grounds). Increase of graffiti on desks during school time. Name and shame process happening at the moment in school. See if support can be given from families for their kids to clean off graffiti in town. Graffiti brochure given to school principal from S/Cs Moore
- Thankyou given to Sgt Wood and his team for a job well done
- Easter Rugby carnival this Easter weekend
- Council given MOU for Development Application (Police and Council)
- Asked if Police Sign on Cobar Road and be changed. It has stated for a very long time now that police are 'Enforcing Speed'. Can it be looked at being changed
- School principal asked committee how the community feel about the High School. All good comments and feedback received. School principal also stated that students have assisted with catering at events and with Seniors etc.
