### **2. Previous minutes – reviewed and accepted.**

### **3. Outstanding actions:**

NO OUTSTANDING ACTIONS FROM PREVIOUS MEETING.

Trail bikes – Insp. Busetto spoke with Fairfield Highway Patrol re: Possible Operation targeting Trail bike riders

Dark coloured Ford in Miller/Busby area – Police spoke with a Person of Interest and action was taken

School Fencing (schools without fences) – Four Schools currently have no new high fencing with two schools being in the process of either upgrading or constructing.

### **4. Commander's Overview – presented by Insp Busetto.**

- Superintendent SZALAJKO unavailable due to him attending the Police graduation Parade at Goulburn.
- Insp. Busetto provided information regarding new Probationary Constables who will be starting at the LAC and the process they will have to undertake (study & work assessments).

Green Valley LAC will be receiving 8 new officers.

Green Valley LAC is currently at strength with officers from other LACs looking to transfer in & existing officers seeking promotion and acting up in supervising roles

**5. Crime Manager’s Overview – Presented by Det Sgt Jason FLOOD**  
**Overview includes a power point presentation prepared by Green valley Intelligence Office.**

- Discussed the evolution of policing over time; how crime is recorded and how performance and achievements are measured.
- Up on Domestic violence related assaults which is good because we are seeing an increase in people reporting domestic violence incidents. Green Valley legal action rate for the month is 78%; this means that Police initiate legal action in 78% of the cases of domestic violence.
- Crime Overall is down which can be attributed to good police work – high proactivity (Person searches, Vehicle searches & Move ons), interacting with people and a high visibility police presence.
- Arrest yesterday 16/12/10 of Murder suspect in Green Valley LAC – job well done from all persons involved

<b>Break Enter and Steal</b>	The Command has experienced a reduction in this crime category. Looking at Statistical trends to task police to those areas
<b>Robbery</b>	Robbery offences are currently LOW in the Command. This is a serious offence and needs to be reported.  Legal action rate over 50%
<b>Stealing</b>	Evenly spread throughout the Command. Many involve retail theft, the goods stolen are alcohol for personal use and also cosmetics which in turn can be sold or exchanged for drugs. From Retail – Up From Person - Up
<b>Malicious Damage</b>	These offences are usually committed by children with things such as rock & egg throwing & graffiti.  Malicious Damage incident are up.  Reporting of these incidents is important so vehicles can be tasked to increased areas
<b>Stolen Motor Vehicles</b>	The Command has experienced a reduction in this crime category. Usually

	stolen number plates.
<b>Fraud</b>	The majority of these incidents relate to <i>Fail to Pay for Petrol</i> . This has risen over the period

## 6. General Discussion:

a) Aiyaz indicated that Miller is being labelled a trouble spot. What is causing the problems & what is police doing to minimise this?

Insp. Busetto stated that it's not just a policing issue. Police can only over see police related issues and arrest & charge those responsible and monitor their behaviour through bail compliance checks & STMP checks. High density housing, housing issues, health and generational problems exist which create a further strain on the area.

b) Insp Busetto relayed information regarding the Community Engagement Project (conducted at Carnes Hill shopping centre, Green Valley Plaza & Cecil Hills shopping centre).

Feed back was positive however some participants indicated that Miller would be an area in which they felt unsafe. Many of the participants who stated this had never even been there before and merely based their response on its reputation. As discussed at previous meetings, it may be an issue of "perception" rather than an appreciation of actual incidents.

c) Constable Retamales relayed information relating to the Police & Youth camp which took place from the 29<sup>th</sup> November 2010 – 1<sup>st</sup> December 2010. 12 children from the 5<sup>th</sup> grade selected from 6 local schools. Each school selected 1 boy & 1 girl to attend with 5 Police officers from Green Valley attending as supervisors. Camp funded by Rotary.

d) George Smith raised concerns regarding fire works in the Green Valley area between Cowpasture Rd, Wilson Rd & Green Valley Rd. Fire works being let off in the area which at all time of the day & night which are causing residents problems.

*\* Insp. Busetto noted this information for taskings.*

e) George Smith raised his concern about hoodlums congregating at the Heckenberg Shopping Centre area between 4pm – 7pm. This is both in on foot and in vehicles.

*\* Insp. Busetto noted this information – possible tasking for General duties*

f) Principal raised concerns about youth congregating behind (Western side) of the Islamic college – access off San Cristobal Dr.

*\* Det. Sgt Flood suggested security at the college should contact Police immediately so police can speak with these people and move them on. Also that they should install some sensor lights at the rear of the premises to act as a deterrent.*

g) Aiyaz raised issue of parking on Wilson Rd outside the Islamic college. He stated newsletters had been sent out to parents which had a positive effect on the parking problems with a further letter to be sent out in the new year. In addition, a traffic controller (lolly pop person) to be employed in the new year to assist with traffic issues.

h) Insp. Busetto to forward proposed dates for next meeting via email with attendees to reply to see if proposed dates suit the majority.

i) Insp. Busetto thanks everyone for their participation over the year and wishes everyone a happy festive season.
