Discussion Items

Meeting commenced: 11.10am

Overview of Community Safety Precinct Committee meetings and how they will be run by Inspector Greentree. CPSC's will be chaired by either Local Area Commander or delegated Duty Officer, Minutes made available through NSW Police website. Not a forum to talk about individual issues. CPSC's will be held quarterly.

Inspector Scott Murray overview on his portfolio commitments being improved Customer Service and to irradiate mixed messages which are in the Community.

Spike in Domestic Violence incidents in December for Warren. This put down to Christmas period. Inspector Greentree indicated he would be tasking DVLO to attend Warren particularly on court dates.

In relation to alcohol related assaults, Mayor Rex WILSON raised issue of how drug-related incidents are recorded. GM Ashley Wielinga raised whether drug testing drivers could be done. Inspector Murray outlined procedures that needed to happen before police could test drivers for drugs.

Rise in figures for B & E into dwellings. Issue of juveniles raised. Inspector Greentree stated he had requested the Department of Education to assist in prosecutions, to become the lead agency when it comes to issues such as truancy.

Discussion in relation to Police visibility. Inspector Greentree outlined that police in Warren are recording a high number of Business Inspections. Police from Bourke will be deployed to Warren in the upcoming weeks to assist Warren officers. New police officer starting in Warren in March. Requested to bring new officer to next council meeting

so they can become familiar with council staff.

Discussion in relation to licensing of major events in Warren such as race meetings. It was requested that the Licensing Sergeant give a licensing presentation in relation to alcohol prior to these events occurring so licensees are aware what is required of them.

Person Searches, RBT both stationary and mobile was good in Warren. Excellent recording of Alcohol Free Zone offences.

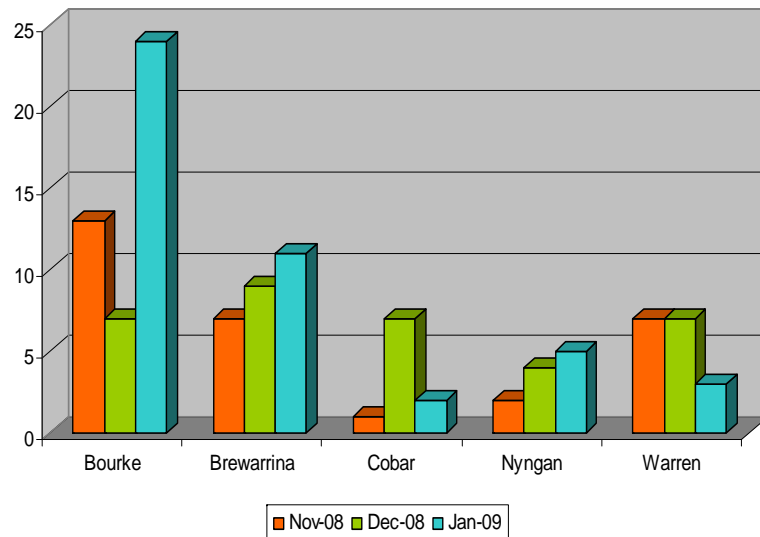
