

What is Crime Stoppers?

Crime Stoppers is a community based initiative which encourages all members of the public to provide information on:

- People wanted by police
- Unsolved crimes and future crime that is being planned
- People you know who have committed criminal offences where they have not been arrested
- Suspicious or unusual activity

If you need to report an emergency call Triple Zero (000).

If you need to report a crime where you are the victim call 131 444.

Crime Stoppers plays an important role in fighting crime. Since 1989 community information to Crime Stoppers has contributed to:

- 3428 arrests
- more than 10 400 charges
- Over \$8.6 million worth of stolen property recovered
- Over \$79 million worth of drugs seized
- 34 homicides, 154 assaults, 235 armed robberies and 783 fraud cases have been solved.

You don't have to give your details to Crime Stoppers when you contact us, however, you can leave your details if you want the police to contact you or if you are happy to speak to police. Always, your information will be confidential.

What happens to your information?

Your information is assessed by NSW Police Force intelligence analysts and sent to your local police for investigation.

What's in it for you?

- A safer community for NSW
- Removing criminals from circulation
- Police and the community working together
- A community that's active in protecting itself
- Raised community awareness
- Personal satisfaction
- Reward of up to \$1000 if your information leads to an arrest.

How do I complete the 'Pass on Information Confidentially' Report'?

Access the '[Pass on Information Confidentially](#)' report by clicking on this link www.crimestoppers.com.au or by accessing the NSW Police Force web site and clicking on the Crime Stoppers number (1800 333 000). This will take you to the '[Pass on Information Confidentially](#)' report.

The '[Pass on Information Confidentially](#)' report seeks information such as:

1) What crime type does your information relate to?

For example, drugs, assault, theft, traffic, etc

2) Who is committing the crime?

This seeks the name, address and other contact details of the person or people committing the crime

3) What do they look like?

This seeks the name, address, physical description and other contact details of the person or people committing the crime

4) What sort of vehicle do they drive?

This seeks the description and unusual features of any vehicles involved in the crime

5) Tell us about the crime?

This asks what, where, when, how and why the crime is happening

6) Providing information to Crime Stoppers can be anonymous. However, if you are happy to speak to the police or you want police to contact you, please include your details.

Remember, you don't have to give your details if you don't want to.
