## Minutes

### 1. Meeting opened at The Hills Shire Council Chambers at 10am

Welcome from Commander Supt. Phillip FLOGEL from The Hills Local Area Command.

### 3. Matters arising from last meeting:

#### 1. Charles MEADER to check if there has been a policy change which explains the dramatic decrease in the graffiti incidents. Addressed by Michael LATHLEAN.

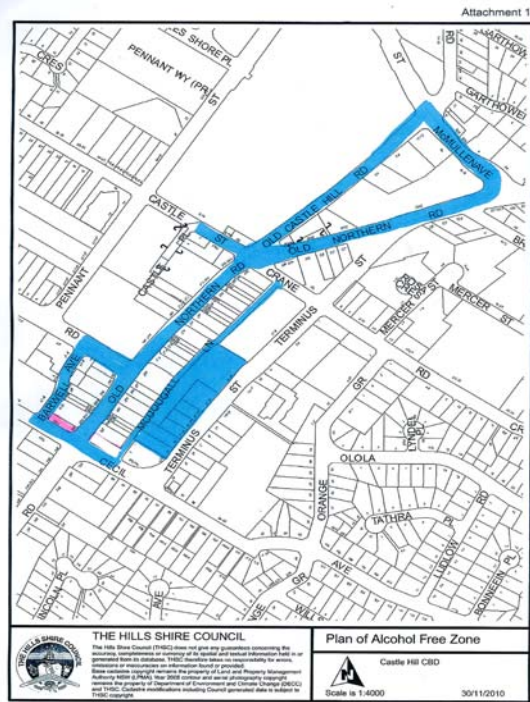
- Graffiti removal by The Hills Shire Council is centralised by one team, "Parks People". One man is used for graffiti removal who is aware of the graffiti hotspots
- RTA traffic signal boxes and Australia Post mail boxes (the postman collection boxes) are the biggest problem spot for graffiti
- Council Officers have been diligent in reporting graffiti
- The Hills Shire Council has a website where there is an E-Form to report graffiti
- Fred Caterson Reserve, Glenhaven Road Bridge and detention base wall Sierra Place are graffiti hotspots
- The Hills Shire Council will also remove graffiti from private property ONLY if accessible from a public place
- Graffiti paint is also being purchased from \$2 shops. **Superintendent FLOGEL advised that shops selling spray cans can be inspected for compliance with the legislation. Police will action and advise at next meeting.**
- Castle Towers and Rouse Hill Shopping Centres also have addressed graffiti removal by rapid removal and use of protective films on hot spot areas
- Superintendent FLOGEL commended the Council and local business on the overall work undertaken that has significantly decreased the incidence of graffiti throughout the community

#### 2. Leon COLOSIMO to provide an update on the Liquor Accord's progress with obtaining fully funded transport for patrons.

- all key venues provide a fully funded option for patrons
- exploring option to pool the transport services currently provided
- raise the possibility of revising the information leaflets for clientele to promote the use of transport services
- **all above issues to be discussed at the next Liquor Accord Meeting will be held on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> November**

#### 3. Charles MEADER to provide an update about the proposed Dan Murphy's liquor store at Castle Hill and the Alcohol Free Zones. Addressed by Councillor Tony HAY.

- Alcohol Free Zones established around the area



**4. Police to provide statistics in relation to the effect that new legislation has had on move on directions. Addressed by Inspector Gary BAILEY.**

- statistics regarding the move on for a single person intoxicated is difficult to retrieve however it would appear that the new provisions of the legislation have not been used yet.

**4. Crime Report**

A general discussion was also held on the crime statistics – presentation delivered to the meeting by The Hills Crime Manager, Detective Inspector Gary BAILEY, on current crime trends.

## 5. General Business:

1. Maintaining Healthy Relationships Forum will be held on the 29<sup>th</sup> of November at The Hills Shire Council Chambers.
2. **Charles MEADER (Compliance Manager for The Hills Shire Council)**  
17 reported dog attacks have been reported to council.
3. **Reward for Conviction**  
Power cable thefts in parks within The Hills Shire (offenders have been sticking magnetic signs on their vehicles to impersonate authorised personnel) and have been driving into parks and light towers stealing brass/copper/etc. Special fasteners are being made up and will be installed by The Hills Shire Council so that they cannot be removed.
4. **White Ribbon Day – Friday 25<sup>th</sup> November 2011**
  - o Police BBQ will be held at Arthur Whitling Park. BBQ commences from 6:30am or 7:00am.
  - o Faye HANSON will be organising a White Ribbon Day stall at the following shopping centres: Castle Towers, Rouse Hill Town Centre, Winston Hills Mall and Stockland Mall Baulkham Hills. Members of the Domestic Violence Committee will be providing wrist bands and white ribbons.
5. **Tony HAY (Councillor)**  
The Hills Shire Council to make an announcement regarding the NSW Police Force Facebook site on their bulletin/newsletter.
6. **Arthur Whitling Park**
  - o an upgrade of lighting and good quality CCTV footage is required (to be installed by council) due to rising and continuing problems with youth in this area
  - o Tony HAY will take this on board by looking at CPTED regarding trees/vegetation and higher resolution cameras in this area. Some cameras have speakers.

Detective Inspector BAILEY raised the need for adequate lighting and good quality CCTV for Arthur Whitling Park	Councillor Tony HAY will take this on board and will be looking at CPTED regarding trees and higher resolution cameras (some cameras have speakers)
