MINSTER PRESENTS POLICE MEDALS IN REDFERN

"This is a tradition which provides an opportunity to recognise the great service carried out by our hard working police officers," Minister Gallacher said.

The Minister also commended local programs such as the Aboriginal Mentoring Group, the Gamarada Healing and Life Skills Program, Tribal Warrior, Babana Mens Group, the Aboriginal Housing Company, Mudgin-gal Women's Centre and Wyanga Aboriginal Aged Care.

"Without the efforts of such motivated and committed people behind these programs, the work of the NSW Police Force would be even harder," Minister Gallacher said.
