He also discussed the effectiveness and the results obtained by Ashfield Police while conducting Region and LAC Operations such as VIKINGS, OBEDIENCE, AVERT, BIKES and Drug Dog Operations. He Stated that police will continue to be proactive as well as educate the local community in road safety awareness particularly along the main arterial roads such as Liverpool Rd, Canterbury and Parramatta Road.. He also discussed the issue of safety in school zones and public education and awareness aimed at improving school zone safety.</p> <p>S/C Kingston gave an overview of Traffic/Highway Operations currently running including, OPTIMUS, OBEDIENCE, TORTOISE, STAY ALERT, AUSTRANS.</p> <p><b><i>Presentation – NSW RailCorp and Crime Prevention.</i></b></p> <p>Mr Beavan discussed the role of RailCorp NSW in terms of crime prevention strategies. He outlined the effectiveness of the multi-agency approach to crime reduction and the relationships between NSW Police, RailCorp, and Local Councils.</p> <p>Mr Beavan also discussed the effectiveness of CCTV surveillance and in detecting and reducing graffiti offences and crime in general along the rail corridors.
