Minutes

1. Meeting opened at The Hills Shire Council Chambers at 10am

Welcome from Chief Inspector BRENNAN from The Hills Local Area Command and introductions from everyone.

2. Apologies:

Superintendant Philip FLOGEL, Senior Constable Robert PATERSON, Senior Constable Jason ROUGHLEY, Faye HANSEN, Aksheya KUMAR

3. Matters arising from last meeting:

1. White Ribbon Day

Hills Police will be hosting a BBQ in the park near the bus terminal on Friday 23rd November 2012 from 6am to 9am.

The Hills Domestic Violence Prevention Committee (DVPC) will be manning information stalls at Castle Hill and Dural Bunnings, from 9am on the Friday.

The DVPC Maintaining Healthy Relationships is also holding a Maintaining Healthy Relationships Forum on Tuesday 27th November from 9am at The Hills Shire Council, with opportunities to break off into smaller workshops during the day. The forum will address domestic violence in youth and anger management issues and guest speaker Ken NATHAN will be talking about adolescent violence in families.

Castle Hill RSL will hold a White Ribbon Day function between 9:30am to 11:30am on Sunday 25th November 2012.

2. Police will report on the progress of the next Community Forum – related to Cyber Crime

Shubha KUMAR stated that the Security Forum will be held on Sunday 10th February 2013 at The Hills Shire Council. The forum is free of charge and open to everyone to attend.

Further details will be worked out and reported at the next meeting.

3. The Hills Shire Council Youth Driving Seminar – 3rd & 4th October 2012

Two information sessions were run, one at Castle Hill and one at Rouse Hill. The speakers were fantastic however the turnout did not reflect the RSVP numbers. In the future the Council will look at running more seminars and will look at marketing the event towards parents as a lot of parents just dropped their children off at the event.

4. Constable SUTERS reported on Scams for Seniors Forum

Run in conjunction with the Department of Fair Trading the information provided about various scams was fantastic however the turnout was fairly poor. The forum was run on Thursday 27th September 2012 at the Vinegar Hill Memorial Library, Rouse Hill Town Centre and a camera crew from A Current Affair was there and ran a segment on scams.

4. Crime Report

A general discussion was also held on the crime statistics – presentation delivered to the meeting by Intelligence Officer Sergeant Nigel JOHNS on current crime trends including:





Non-DV Assaults – There were 71 non-domestic violence assaults in the 2nd quarter of 2012 and 58 assaults in the 3rd quarter of 2012 showing a decrease of 18%

• 32% of incidents occurred in a Public Place (which includes streets, footpaths, parks etc), 15% on Licensed Premises, 25% on Residential Premises, 15% on Business

Premises and 5% on Education Premises.

- The main hot spots for Non DV Assaults are the Castle Hill CBD and Rouse Hill.
- The Command continues to focus on operations at Licensed Premises to reduce alcohol related assaults. The Command is working with the Licensees to reduce offences on Licensed Premises.

DV Assaults – There were 52 domestic violence assaults recorded in the 2nd quarter of 2012 and 74 for the 3rd quarter of 2012 showing an increase of 42%

- A lot of the issues with increasing the reporting domestic violence is that the victim does not know their rights, they don't realise they are being physiologically abused.
- Schools are mandatory reporters for domestic violence.
- No specific age group in The Hills, ranges from 10yo through to people in their 70s and 80s.
- DV Assaults remains a Command priority with all incidents reviewed by the Senior Management Team on a daily basis.
- Supervisors are attending all domestic violence assault matters.
- The Command is participating in activities to raise the public's awareness about Domestic Violence.
- Only a small percentage are repeat offenders.

Break, Enter & Steal – There were 158 Break and Enters recorded in the 2nd quarter of 2012 and 170 incidents in the 3rd quarter showing an increase 7%

- Thieves don't want to go too deep into unknown suburbs, they want to be able to have a quick escape route planned.
- Aggravated offences have decreased significantly in 2012.
- One offender has been charged with 4 offences in this Command after he was identified on CCTV. He has also been charged with a number of offences in Parramatta LAC. This offender targeted shops in shopping centres. He was relieved to be arrested because, whilst in custody, he will get help with his drug addiction.
- Two males were charged with aggravated Break and Enter after an incident at Castle Hill where firearms were produced. One male was from Castle Hill and the other from Dharruk.

Major Motor Vehicle Accidents – There were 362 major MVAs in the 2nd quarter of 2012 and 336 incidents in the 3rd quarter 2012 showing a decrease of 7%

- 77 injury collisions were recorded during the 2nd quarter of 2012 and 61 injury collisions in the 3rd quarter of 2012 resulting in an increase of 16.
- Only judged on injury and fatal accidents.
- Main areas on congestion are Windsor Road, Showground Road and also the freeway on/exit ramps where a lot of tow away accidents occur.
- Rates have remained reasonably static for several years in the Command but are now showing an upward trend.

- Main hot spots are centred around CBD of Castle Hill and major roads with particular emphasis on entry and exit ramps of freeways.
- Higher rain fall and increased traffic volume are responsible for the increase in accidents.
- The Hills HWP are now part of the state wide Traffic and Highway Patrol Command whose primary goal is the reduction of road trauma. The main benefit of this is a more co-ordinated approach.

Malicious Damage – There were 239 Malicious Damage incidents reported in the 2nd quarter of 2012. There were 203 incidents reported in the 3rd quarter 2012 showing a decrease of 15%

- Always an under reported crime.
- Malicious damage can be anything from egging a house to smashing windows.
- We will be releasing images on our FaceBook site of persons that may assist us in malicious damage offences but only if Police state wide cannot identify them.
- Egging is of particular concern with houses and vehicles targeted.
- Graffiti is still a problem. 21% of all reported incidents were graffiti. There is obviously a large number of unreported incidents.
- 7% of incidents are Domestic Violence related.
- The Hills LAC have recently joined with VandalTrak to assist in identifying graffiti vandals.

Stealing – There were 344 Stealing incidents in the 2nd quarter of 2012. There were 323 incidents in the 3rd quarter of 2012 showing a decrease of 6%

- Steal from motor vehicle offences are still an issues around here, no matter how much we plead with the community to lock their vehicles and remove their valuables.
- Strategies to reduce these offences include CCTV in car parks, security patrols in the shopping centre car parks and Police patrols.
- Shop lifting hot spots remain centred on the two main shopping Centres.
- Steal from Motor Vehicle incidents accounted for 40% of all stealing incidents with the majority of incidents occurring on Residential and Outdoor Public Places (this includes vehicles parked on streets).
- Stolen vehicle registration plates continue to account for 13% of all property types stolen.
- CCTV is a useful tool to Police. Most stealing offences that occur in retail areas are captured on CCTV.
- Thefts of wallets and mobiles have increased at licensed premises.

5. General Business:

 Charles MEADER mentioned that dog attacks are down to 7 for this quarter. The dog attack information that Charles provided to Cst SUTERS was placed on The Hills FaceBook site and was shared state wide with other LACs and NHW groups. Matt SLATTERY from West Pennant Hills NHW requested the information to release in the next newsletter.

- 2. Cst SUTERS to book the dates for next year and will vary the day of the week it is to be held on.
- **3. Mr. BRENNAN** mentioned the Bella Vista Farm Carols to be held on Wednesday 19th December 2012 which is a ticketed event to be limited to 3,000 people. Council and Police are heavily involved, four Police will be patrolling as well as Constable SUTERS will have a stall with volunteers and possibly a Police Dog and Motorbike.
- 4. Mr BRENNAN stated that the Highway Patrol Officers are no longer part of our command. They are still based at out station however are not run through the Command. David ELLIOTT questioned the presence of Highway Patrol on the M2 and this is part of Operation Free Flow. The officers are using number plate recognition software and will pull over vehicles, even in peak hour which will often slow traffic. David ELLIOTT also mentioned that he would not pursue the installation of a speed camera on Green Road as Police presence has increased and the RMS have just recently installed the new parking spots for Highway Patrol to park. Police are attempting to have the mobile speed camera frequent the Road however the RMS is the authority who will determine where speed cameras are installed. If a speed camera is installed on Green Road Police presence would still remain the same as they are also there to prevent other offences such as break and enter offences
