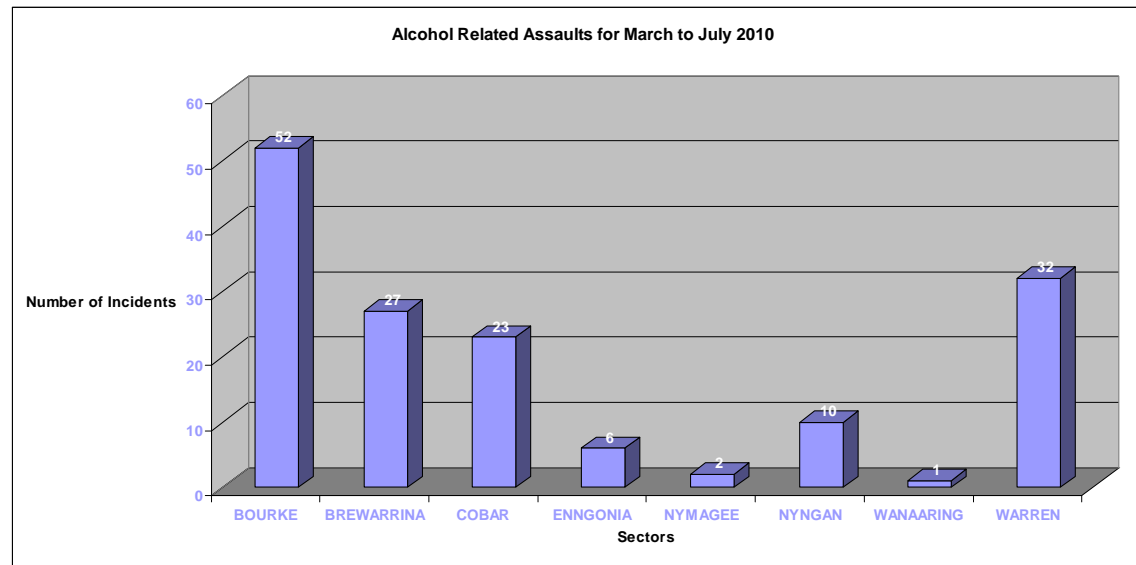
Discussion Item

- Superintendent Thomas reiterated the need for open communication between Police and the Council & praised local Police
- Overview given of the proposal for the Brahmy Group farm north of Bourke – intensive rehabilitation for repeat offenders and has a good success rate in other areas. Cost the same as juvenile detention & has support of local MPs as well as the local Bourke community. Also discussed the success of Yeta at Brewarrina.
- Increase in alcohol related offences – due largely to the mines expanding (increase in population) and the fact that some new families have moved to the area. It was noted that the NSWPF encourage the reporting of DV offences.
- Calls to Bourke need to be forwarded to local Cobar Police. All Bourke staff have been advised of the correct procedures – new staff to be educated & Cobar phones to be diverted to the Cobar mobile when out of the Station
- Full strength of staff at Cobar now
