Overview of statistical data by Detective Inspector Brett Greentree for Bourke Shire Council in comparison with other Darling River LGA's.

Discussion Item

Welcome by Detective Inspector Brett Greentree.

- *Move On directions and legislation discussed. Mentioned that local youth are congregating at the IGA and it looks bad. Mentioned that security staff is not moving the kids on. It was suggested that the police are called to move them on*
- *An MOU for Development Applications given to council for review and signing. (Police and Council)*
- *Suggested that for future presentation that graphs are combined. That there are two many graphs to go through. Det Insp GREENTREE said he would inform his Intel office about this suggestion*
- *It was mentioned that there is an increase of graffiti in town. New toilet block near wharf already has graffiti on it. New DOC's/JIRT building has graffiti on it with name. Police informed that committee that these offences have not been reported and police should be notified*
- *Trucks in Mitchell Street still have refrigeration going late at night and early hours of the morning, disturbing residents. Truck drivers are using this area as a truck depot. It is also a blind spot for traffic using the intersection when a truck is parked at this location. As you are coming out of Waraweena Street, you cannot see oncoming traffic.*
- *Committee informed of follow-up action in relation to the Taxi Stand in the IGA. Informed that the RTA does not endorse this as a road related area and that signage cannot be erected for a taxi stand at this location. It is classified as a private car park. Therefore community members can park in these spots.*
- *Community feedback in relation to poor customer service from local police. Mentioned that it has taken police to long to respond to jobs. That a customer attended the police station and waited for a long period before being attended to, even though police were in the station. Being told police will turn up and no-one does. There was the possibility of a break and enter taking place, and the informant waited for over an hour for police to attend, eventually Cst Rheinberger attended and dealt with job. Committee informed that if they are not satisfied with police response, to contact on duty Sgt. Supt Thomas stated that the LAC is always trying to improve customer service*
