Overview of statistical data for Bogan Shire Council presented by Sergeant Tony Wood, in comparison with other Darling River LAC LGAs.

Discussion Item

- *overview of crime statistics – Nyngan figures compare favourably to Warren & Cobar – due to the effective strategies in place in relation to alcohol related crime*
- *the old hospital site and the unused garage across the railway line from the RSL Club are attracting vandals*
- *Discussion of drug use in the area. Ambulance Officers confirmed injectable drugs not a problem locally. Truck drivers and people passing through Nyngan may be using needles. High school has isolated instances of cannabis use. No problems with the mines due to their drug & alcohol policy – tested daily.*
- *Alcohol continues to be bought by parents for their children – private parties in particular are a problem. Parents need to be reminded that provision of alcohol to under 18yo is an offence.*
- *Crime spikes caused by Bourke/Dubbo groups travelling through Nyngan*
- *Graffiti is a growing problem and Police are targeting this – ordering offenders to clean up*

- There was a request for Police to target school zones by School Principal
- Bourke handling of phone calls was raised – Supt Thomas reinforced that Bourke Police are aware of the procedures regarding calls from outlying sectors
- Mayor questioned the loss of administrative staff within the Police and was advised of the restructure
