4. Commander's Overview – presented by A/Superintendent Corry.

- Superintendent SZALAJKO unavailable as he is on long term leave
- A/Superintendent Corry introduced himself and gave an overview of his service history within the NSW Police Force.
 - New Mobile Police Station & its use
 - New exhibits computer system in use for more accurate and efficient means of handling exhibits (evidence).

5. Crime Manager's Overview – Presented by Det Inspector Con Galea

- Discussed the link between Police pro-activity & the reduction of crime categories.
- Concerns regarding Miller as its readily identified as an area for Anti-social behaviour
- Ranking of Green Valley LAC within the state and comparison to other LACs – Green Valley predominately in the lower third in most categories which is good
- Tasking & deployment of staff based on crime trends. Police spend 17% of total time in Miller area. Geographical tasking given to police.
- Operations being conducted within LAC – Dynamite (daily – staff deployed to 'hot spot' within LAC), Vikings (fortnightly / monthly - State government funded operation focused on high visibility policing), Compliance (monthly – traffic orientated), Unite (quarterly – licensing, alcohol related offences)

Break Enter and Steal	The Command has experienced a reduction in this crime category. Looking at Statistical trends to task Police to those areas most effected
Robbery	Robbery offences are currently LOW in the Command. This is a serious offence and needs to be reported.
Stealing	Evenly spread throughout the Command. Stealing from retail stores is up however there are still a small number of incidents being recorded.
Malicious Damage	Malicious Damage incident are up. Predominately Domestic Violence

	related. Reporting of these incidents is important so vehicles can be tasked to increased areas.
Stolen Motor Vehicles	The Command has experienced an increase in this crime category. Usually stolen number plates.
Fraud	Frauds are up for the period due to one offender committing a high number of offences (has been arrested & charged)

6. General Discussion:

- a) Kamrun Rahman – Is looking at possible council funded projects to be launched in the Miller CBD related to alcohol related issues.
- * *Constable Retamales – noted (discuss possible projects with Kamrun)*
- b) Colleen Boler– Raised concerns regarding the Miller HUB area & children congregating on skateboards and hanging onto passing buses as they pass. This is occurring from 2pm onward.
- * *Inspector Busetto – noted - reiterated that this is a location that car crews are tasked to attend and conduct proactive patrols.*
- c) General Group discussion – Cleanliness of the Miller area with constant dumping of household whitegoods & rubbish. Discussion regarding Council Rangers enforcing & fining offenders.
- * *Council perspective – New rubbish compactor being utilised to deal with rubbish concerns*
- * *More Household rubbish pick ups and better advertising of the pick up dates*
- * *Funding Grants have been applied for a graffiti removal vehicle – rapid removal to improve the appearance of the area*
- d) Sandra Kubecka – Discussion of last meeting minutes regarding the possibility of a trail bike operation
- * *Inspector Busetto – Lack of resources state-wide. These are a scarce resource and the demand for operations is high.*
- * *Inspector Galea – Parks / Council land needs to improve their access control to and from these areas*
