

# SECURITY IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY



## Reporting suspicious behaviour may disrupt an attack.

Terrorists and criminals often conduct hostile reconnaissance and rehearsals as part of their attack planning and preparation. The ability to detect possible hostile reconnaissance or other suspicious behaviour may disrupt or even prevent an attack. Behavioural indicators may include:



Unusual building surveillance such as noting exits and security in high patronage areas.



Unusual interest in security measures and routines, including over-inquisitive, unusual or persistent questions.



Recurring visitors or loiterers, with weak reasoning for their presence on site.



Anxious or nervous behaviour such as clock watching, shaking or pacing.



Attempting to remain inconspicuous, or leaving the area if noticed or avoiding security and CCTV.



Attempting to gain illegitimate access to premises (impersonating staff, tailgating through controlled areas).



Suspicious vehicle activity in close proximity to the site.
