

FIREARMS PERMIT HEIRLOOM AUTHORITY AND CONDITIONS

Firearm types which apply: No more than 3 firearms (with a matched pair of firearms considered to be a single firearm), acquired as an heirloom.

Authority

This permit authorises the permit holder to possess, <u>but not use</u> a firearm and/or a matched pair of firearms, acquired as an heirloom.

The permit holder is not authorised to hold more than one heirloom permit at any one time with the permit authorising no more than 3 firearms (with a matched pair of firearms considered to be a single firearm).

This permit does not authorise the purchase of any ammunition.

The authority conferred by this permit is subject to the *Firearms Act 1996* and the associated Regulation and all the General Legislative Requirements applicable to a firearm permit holder¹ apply to this permit in addition to the conditions outlined below.

Conditions:

- 1. A category A or B firearm authorised by this permit must be stored in compliance with the safe storage requirements prescribed by section 40 of the *Firearms Act 1996*².
- 2. A category C, or D, or H firearm authorised by this permit must be stored in compliance with the safe storage requirements prescribed by section 41 of the *Firearms Act 1996*³.
- 3. The permit holder must ensure that the firearm/s authorised by this permit are rendered permanently inoperable.
