6. OVERVIEW OF CURRENT CRIME TRENDS

OVERVIEW OF CURRENT CRIME TRENDS Discussed by Crime Manager- Inspector Stacey Maloney

- Personal Crime's under control. Robbery reduced by -60.7% and common assault increased 5.0%.
- Property Crime is down and travelling well, in particular Break and enter
 non Dwelling (reduced by -21.2%).
- Break and Enter Dwelling has reduced by -44.7%. Steal from dwelling reduced by 23.8%
- Mal. Damage is reduced by -19.9%
- Stolen Vehicles reduced by 44.5%
- Steal from retail has also reduced by 10.0%.
- Steal from Motor Vehicle offences have reduced by -24.4%
- Alcohol related crime is low. Licensed premises going well, no real issues. Police present at licensed premises - conducting safety audit on licensed premises.
- NSW Police is encouraging people to report crime (Domestic and non-Domestic related crime).

7. NSW Aviation Support – Pol Air

Discussed by Special Constable Matt Stanton

- Discussed the role of the NSW Pol Air
- Special Constable Stanton explained about the area covered by NSW Pol Air.
- NSW Pol Air is located at Bankstown Airport and consist of 6 helicopters and 3 aircraft.
- Due to short of staff, Pol Air operating hours are 7.00am to 5.00pm, Monday to Sunday and 5.00pm to 3.00am, Thursday to Sunday. Supervisor's desk is managed 20 hours a day. Supervisor's work to manage task's, crew and aircrafts.
- There is 3 crew members in the helicopter 2 Police Tactical Flight Officers and one pilot on board
- Type of jobs NSW Pol Air is involved in:
 - Crime Scene photography photos or video footage,
 - Surveillance,
 - Winged lifting,
 - Event management and Downlink,
 - Search for Missing Persons,
 - Water rescue.
 - Cannabis identifying of Hydroponic grow
 - Air Crash Investigation,
 - Static displays,
 - Moving Map Display show accuracy of mapping display (build by cops for Cops).
- Any member of NSW Police Force can request Pol Air "Red Permits" (priority entry that is limited to life threatening jobs and if needed, can shut the Airport).
