



Report a missing person

You can report a missing person when

- someone is missing
- and**
- you are worried about their safety and health. For example, they have **not** come home from work.



To report a missing person

- go to the police station
- or
- ask for the police to visit you.



You do **not** have to wait 24 hours to report someone missing.

It is **not** against the law to go missing. The person who is missing will **not** get into trouble.

Bring to the police station
the missing person's



- photo
- phone numbers



- medical information. For example, medications and doctors names.



- bank account details.

You must also bring

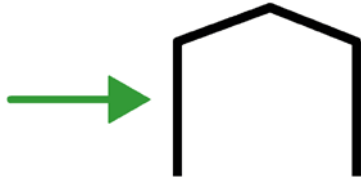


- a list of
 - names
 - phone numbers

and

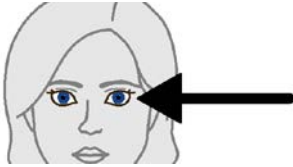
 - addresses

for the missing person's friends and family.



- a list of places the missing person might go.

For example, work places or favourite places.



- a description of the missing person.

For example, hair colour, eye colour, height and weight.

Police will ask you what you think happened to the missing person.
