Agenda Items	Comments
Welcome	<ul> <li>Snr Cst Rebecca Leo welcomed all present. Introduced Botany Bay PAC Commander, Superintendent Hodder.</li> <li>Snr Cst Leo provided an overview of the role of the Community Safety Precinct Committee.</li> <li>This meeting provides local community members to meet with police and discuss crime in the community, develop solutions to local crime, improve public safety, and raise understanding between policing and crime reduction.</li> </ul>
Current Issues	<ul> <li>Steal from Dwelling - mail theft has decreased from last reported period however there has been an increase in fraud incidents. Property recorded includes, currency, clothing, bikes and keys. This crime is increasing statewide.</li> <li><i>Crime prevention strategies being implemented are safety audits, letter box drops, BBLAC Facebook page sharing safety tips and Operations.</i></li> </ul>

• DA (Development applications): Building Applications submitted to build new buildings (commercial and residential) and also renovations.
• Police and council add DA recommendations, examples for mail boxes to be built internally, shrubs trimmed low for street visibility (no hiding places for offenders) and CCTV to cover this area.
<ul> <li>NW Mascot is experiencing Break and Enter (Dwelling) including underground garages, due to the development of residential and commercial properties.</li> </ul>
• Crime prevention strategies being implemented are letter box drops re safety tips, safety audits and patrolled taskings, there are major issues with the design of property buildings with fencing, access to mail boxes.
BB Intel Unit gather Information then pass onto Officers who are then tasked to go to certain locations at certain times in order to carry out proactive policing duties.
<ul> <li>Proactive policing includes: move on directions, person searches and HVP (High visibility patrols) on foot or in a marked Police car.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Crime prevention strategies being implemented are increased shoplifting operations, more Loss Prevention Officers utilised by businesses, better quality CCTV, Facebook circulation of suspects have ended with good ID results and Security Audits carried out.</li> </ul>
• <u>Shoplifting Operations</u> involve plain clothes Police attending retail locations targeting offenders. These operations run regularly and will increase during busier times of the year (School holidays)
• CPO can carry out a <u>Security Audit</u> in Business and Residential settings, by identifying the repeated crime pattern, then looking at different strategies using CPTED, and putting recommendations in place that are cost effective, and result in crime reduction.
<ul> <li>CPTED – Crime prevention through environmental design.</li> <li>1. We look at what the problem / problems are.</li> <li>2. We gather information such as conditions and factors that contribute to opportunities for crime.</li> <li>3. We put strategies and or proactive measures in place tailored to suit the problem and location, and also make recommendations, (which can involve community input).</li> <li>4. We see results.</li> </ul>

Eg. A Chemist has reported several thefts over the last two weeks, Main item being vitamins. CPO attends and observes vitamins stocked in last aisle (Register located on opposite side of store) and shelving / aisles between last aisle and register are above head height – obstructing sightlines. A recommendation would be to lower shelving so employees can have clear sights of all customers over shelving.

## Domestic violence.

Crime prevention strategies being implemented include DV Suspect Targeting Management Plan (STMP) operation, monitoring, taskings, letter box drops on home safety awareness and safety audits.

- DV STMP operations are run regularly and involve Police visits to offenders home, talking to both the offender and victim ensuring victim's needs are being meet and offenders are complying with their AVO conditions.
- Target Action Management Plan for DV offenders consist of each unit within the BBLAC managing recidivist DV offenders. A case is created for each offender. Each unit will visit their nominated offenders house on a regular basis and once again make sure they are complying with their AVO conditions and also make them aware they are being monitored. The offenders cases are updated regularly with the results of monitoring activities.

## Assaults (Non DV) Eg Neighbour disputes / Road rage incidences.

Assaults (Alcohol related Non DV) Eg Licensed premises.

- Crime prevention strategies being implemented are, working together with Housing/ Implementing security audits/ increased in proactivity.
- Increased traffic patrols Ops, enforcing road rules.
- Increase in Licencing Ops / Business inspections. Licencing Officer having regular meetings re Liquor laws and enforcement.

## Mal Dam and SFMV.

- Crime prevention strategies being implemented are, increased patrols / proactivity around hot spot areas.
- Facebook postings on safety tips.
- Youth OPS (consists of mobile and foot patrols around hot spot areas such as Eastgardens, schools etc) talking to youth.

	Intelligence Officer Snr Cst Renae Nicholson presented the crime trends in the PAC since the last meeting.
	Side Notes:
	<ul> <li>Steal from Person (SFP) consists of any person taking something off another person within arm's reach.</li> <li>Other steals include things like stealing a bike of a veranda or a pot plant from a front garden.</li> <li>Assaults usually fall under Domestic Violence situations, Alcohol fuelled patrons at / or around licenced premises" and road rage assaults have been on the rise recently.</li> <li>SFMV were on the rise over the last 3-month period.</li> <li>The higher rates of crime in Mascot are attributed to the continuous movement of people around the train station and the developments of high rise buildings being built in the area.</li> </ul>
	Proactive Crime Team A/Sgt Cheyne Burgess discussed crime prevention strategies.
	Proactivity:
	<ul> <li>Person searches, Move On's, Drug Detections, Bail Compliances have been running throughout the past three months, with a successful result.</li> </ul>
	Examples:

	<ol> <li>Drug Detection (27) - Mascot</li> <li>Person Search (118) – Eastlakes</li> <li>Move on (23) - Botany</li> <li>Comparison between the Sept/Nov and Dec/Feb period:         <ul> <li>aspects of crime were down except stealing from a retail store, Break and Enter, Steal from Dwelling and Steal from Motor Vehicle.</li> </ul> </li> </ol>
	Crime Prevention Tips for Small Businesses
	<ul> <li>Natural surveillance (Clear sight lines / ability to be seen through the naked eye). Eg. Can you be seen from outside? Landscaping trimmed low to prevent visual obstruction.</li> <li>Access &amp; Control CCTV / Lighting / gates / barriers / Locks.</li> <li>Territorial Reinforcement Public/private space obvious. Eg. Cash register area concealed and off limits to customers. Have clear signage "Premises under CCTV surveillance".</li> </ul>
	Ongoing Crime Prevention Targets and Strategies
Delegated Actions	<ul> <li>Regular Shoplifting Operations (Includes Westfield) Plain clothes.</li> <li>Crime Prevention Operations including safety audits for businesses and residential premises. Weekly community engagements (Crime prevention stall)</li> <li>Licensing Operation – Licensed venues targeting alcohol</li> </ul>
	Side Note:
	Discussion with retail workers about what they should do when a theft occurs. Reporting the theft asap (better description of POI) to Police rather then the Police Assistance Line (PAL). Strategies – Installing a High definition camera. Superintendent HODDER stated that there is high retail theft but there is a high conviction rate.
	<ul> <li>(Westfield Operations) Sgt Burgess stated that the Police are working with Westfield on issuing banning notices for Juveniles who continue to trespass.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Youth Liaison Officer: LSC Rachel Warn</li> <li>Youth Operations – Public Schools</li> <li>Operation JAT – Juvenile Truancy</li> <li>Plain cloths officers on Buses (recent problem with girls targeting Asian Students)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Licencing Officer: LSC Rachel Warn</li> <li>Development of high rises means more licenced cafes.</li> <li>Firearms, safety audits, inspections.</li> <li>BB Liquor Accord – Twice per year.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Traffic Officer: Snr Cst Weissel</li> <li>Discussed the different traffic operations</li> <li>Heavy Vehicle compliance /public passenger vehicle compliance /RBT / General traffic enforcement.</li> </ul>
