Liquor Act 2007	103(1)	A hotelier must when the hotel is not authorised to be open for the sale or supply of liquor and at any time when the sale or supply is permitted only for consumption in a specified part of the hotel, close and keep closed every bar area of the hotel.	2
Liquor Act 2007	103(2)	The holder of a packaged liquor licence must, at any time when the licensed premises are not authorised to be open for the sale of liquor, close and keep closed to the public that part of any counter or place at which liquor is usually sold or supplied.	4
Liquor Act 2007	117(8)	A licensee must not, on licensed premises, allow liquor to be sold or supplied to a minor.	34
Liquor Act 2007	124(1)(a)	If a minor enters a bar area of a hotel or club premises the licensee is guilty of an offence.	26
Liquor Act 2007	124(1)(b)	If a minor enters a part of a hotel to which a minors area authorisation is in force, but is not in the company of a responsible adult the licensee is guilty of an offence.	51
Liquor Act 2007	124(2)(a)	If a minor is in a bar area of a hotel or club premises, the licensee is guilty of an offence unless the minor is immediately removed from the area or premises concerned.	1
Liquor Act 2007	124(2)(b)	If a minor is in a part of a hotel to which a minors area authorisation is in force, but is not in the company of a responsible adult, the licensee is guilty of an offence unless the minor is immediately removed from the area or premises concerned.	7
Liquor Act 2007	73(1)(a)	A licensee must not permit intoxication, on the licensed premises.	91
Liquor Act 2007	73(2)	A licensee or an employee or agent of a licensee must not, on the licensed premises, sell or supply liquor to an intoxicated person.	22
Liquor Act 2007	88(1)	The licensee of any licensed premises to which a late hour entry declaration applies must not permit patrons to enter the licensed premises during the time the declaration applies.	1
Liquor Act 2007	9(2)(a)	Without limiting subsection (1), a licensee must not keep licensed premises open for the sale or supply of liquor, at a time when the licensee is not authorised under this Act to sell or supply liquor.	8
Liquor Act 2007	9(2)(b)	Without limiting subsection (1), a licensee must not sell or supply liquor, at a time when the licensee is not authorised under this Act to sell or supply liquor.	40
Liquor Regulation 2008	31(1)	A licensee must cause a notice that contains the following words to be displayed in the licensed premises as per this clause - IT IS AGAINST THE LAW TO SELL OR SUPPLY ALCOHOL TO, OR TO OBTAIN ALCOHOL ON BEHALF OF, A PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF 18 YEARS.	329
Liquor Regulation 2008	32(1)	A licensee who offers liquor for sale through an Internet site must display on the site a notice as follows - LIQUOR ACT 2007 IT IS AGAINST THE LAW TO SELL OR SUPPLY ALCOHOL TO, OR TO OBTAIN ALCOHOL ON BEHALF OF, A PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF 18 YEARS.	1
Liquor Regulation 2008	33(2)	A licensee must cause a notice that contains the following words to be displayed, in accordance with this clause, in the bar area of the hotel or club premises concerned - PERSONS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 YEARS ARE NOT PERMITTED IN THIS AREA BY LAW.	145
Liquor Regulation 2008	34(1)	A hotelier must cause a notice containing the words specified in subclause (3) to be displayed, in accordance with this clause, in any area of the hotel to which a minors area authorisation relates.	119
Liquor Regulation 2008	34(2)	The holder of an on-premises licence that relates to a public entertainment venue must cause a notice containing the words specified in subclause (3) to be displayed in any area of the licensed premises in which entertainment is provided.	19
