



## REPORTING CRIME TO LOCAL POLICE -

## People who are Deaf or hard of hearing, or who have a speech impairment

if you prefer to phone or attend your local police station and speak with police, you can find the phone number and location of your local police station by visiting the NSW Police Force website [https://www.police.nsw.gov.au/about\\_us/regions\\_commands\\_districts/police\\_station\\_search](https://www.police.nsw.gov.au/about_us/regions_commands_districts/police_station_search). Using this link, you can search for your local police station via entering your suburb, town name or postcode. You are able to have a support person, friend or relative with you when you report crime to the police.

The NSW Police Force supports the needs of people who are Deaf or hard of hearing, or who have a speech impairment. Being able to report crime through an Auslan interpreter at any time of the day or night, is a way in which police can ensure that your needs are met. It is free of charge to you.
