INSTRUMENT OF APPROVAL*FIREARMS ACT 1996*

As delegate of the Commissioner of Police, I make this Instrument of Approval in accordance with section 40 of the *Firearms Act 1996* and provide that the following be the type approved by the Commissioner:

Pursuant to section 40(1)(a) of the *Firearms Act 1996*, the locked receptacle must be made of steel or hardwood that is not easily penetrable; and a commercially manufactured safe designed for securing firearms.

Pursuant to section 40(1)(c) of the *Firearms Act 1996*, the locks of such a receptacle must have:

- a three-point locking system with an internal locking mechanism that secures at various points around the door; or
- the door must have an alternative locking mechanism equivalent to, or exceeding, the three-point locking mechanism (such as a deadlock or padlock). If the door of the receptacle has external locks (such as padlocks) the locks must have a minimum body width of 40mm and a hardened steel shackle.

Pursuant to section 40(1)(d) of the *Firearms Act 1996*, an approved locked container for ammunition storage is:

- a locked metal container, or
- a commercially manufactured locked container designed for storing ammunition, or,
- a commercially manufactured firearm safe containing an integral lockable steel compartment within the safe.

This Instrument of Approval takes effect from the date of signature.
