#### **BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE PREVIOUS MINUTES:**

An overview of crime was presented via Power Point presentation in the following categories: Assault (Alcohol and non DV); Break & Enter (dwelling); Malicious Damage; Injury and Fatal crashes; Robbery; Stolen Vehicle; Steal from Motor Vehicle, Drug Detection, Person searches and move on Direction.

Det. Ch/Insp Terry O'Neill addressed the meeting with crime hotspots and local operations including the state-wide Traffic Safety initiatives 'Operation MERRETT'

Other crime Hot Spots were Miranda, Cronulla, Sutherland & Caringbah regarding Stealing, Break & Enter and assault related offences.

Proactivity Hot Spots locations were Caringbah – highest number of Person Searches & Drug detections. Miranda was the second highest suburb for overall pro-activity, Sutherland was third in ranking for overall pro activity and Cronulla was the fourth highest for pro activity.

#### **Proactive Crime Team:**

A recent article in The Leader, displayed to the Committee, highlighted the concept of operation for the High Visibility Policing (HVP) Unit since the commencement of the Sutherland Shire PAC. Officers in the HVP Unit are based at Miranda Police Station and service the whole of the Command. They perform a variety of patrol duties including vehicle, foot, bike and use of the Utility All-Terrain Vehicles (UATV). As outlined in the HVP Unit article, this Unit has made many arrests and charges across the whole of the Command.

## **Community Engagements:**

A number of Community Engagements have been conducted (still continuing) to engage the local community in promoting the amalgamation of the two previous Local Area Commands into the Sutherland Shire Police Area Command (PAC). Police distributed information pamphlets which explained to the community the re-engineering program and explained that business 'as usual' about police targeting local crime with high visibility police strategies. Emphasis was also on the technology that was available to police which makes them a 'mobile police station' and is able better serve the community.

Community Engagements were held at Engadine, Kareela Shopping Centre, Cronulla and Menai with future engagements planed at Cronulla Mall, Sylvania Southgate, Menai Market Place and Engadine town Square.

Future engagements will be held at Engadine Town Square – Wednesday 30 May 2018 & Engadine markets Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> June.

'Coffee with a Cop' is an annual state-wide community engagement where all PAC's spend a morning engaging the local community over a cup of coffee. Our locations were held at Caringbah RWS and 'Café Y (Project Youth) at Menai Market Place The annual 'Relay for Life' was held at Don Lucas Reserve on 6 May, 2018 with over 3 thousand participants – nil issues arising.

### <u>Outreach</u>

Street based outreach engaging with young people who access public space.

- Sutherland is the latest 'hot spot' on Friday nights, both around the Station and at various residential houses.
- Friday Outreach now starts at Greenhills skate park around 3pm and then moves onto Sutherland at night.
- Have had 1 incident at Greenhill's with some young adults drinking and hassling the other users. Outreach staff were able to move them on and drove them to Cronulla.
- Sutherland Council, after 15 years of funding the Outreach service, now requires Project Youth to apply for funding each year. We have an application in however will not find out if this service will continue next year until mid June.

#### Court Support

Assisting young people attending Sutherland Children's Court.

- Court has been very busy
- Project Youth has arranged for other services to come and support us and the young people on Children's Court day
- We are making lots of new contacts with young people

## HYAP - Homessless Youth Assistance Program

- Both mentoring and family support programs have waiting lists
- Getting more referrals than we have mentors
- St George in particular has grown in number of referrals

# <u>Other</u>

- Have a large number of young people with severe mental health issues at the moment. Currently have around 5 who are in mental health units in both St George, Sutherland and RPA hospitals.
- Also have a couple who need to be in patients at mental health units however it is difficult getting them in.
- A note that Project Youth has workers available to conduct group work and individualised case management within schools. Currently working in Cronulla High, Port Hacking High. Jannali High and soon Sylvania High.

# Police/ Project Youth partnerships programs

Kickstart is re-commencing in Term 3. Program for young males who are known to Police. Young people are picked up at 6am and taken to Shark Park where they do an hour of fitness, are fed a healthy breakfast and then taken to school.

Girls Group - in partnership with Police YLO and PCYC Youth Case Manager commences 31st May. This program targets young women who are at risk and they are taken to Sutherland PCYC and participate in life skills programs. This week they are going to feed the homeless in Kings Cross on Friday night.

Island Time - Leadership program for young Islander students at Endeavour High School.
