INSTRUMENT OF APPROVAL

FIREARMS ACT 1996

As delegate of the Commissioner of Police, I make this Instrument of Approval in accordance with section 41 of the *Firearms Act 1996* and provide that the following be the type approved by the Commissioner:

Pursuant to section 41(1)(a) of the *Firearms Act 1996*, the locked steel safe for the storage of firearms not actually being used or carried, must be a locked steel safe which is a commercially manufactured safe designed for securing firearms. When mounted onto brick, stone, or concrete, to be attached by at least four appropriately secured anchor points, internally fitted through holes in the rear and/or base, securing it to the floor and/or wall. When mounted into main wall studs, to be secured to the wall studs and/or floor joists by at least four appropriately secured anchor points.

Pursuant to section 41(1)(c) of the *Firearms Act 1996*, an approved locked container for ammunition storage is:

- a locked metal container, or
- a commercially manufactured locked container designed for storing ammunition, or,
- a commercially manufactured firearm safe containing an integral lockable steel compartment within the safe.

This Instrument of Approval takes effect from the date of signature.
