1. INTRODUCTION A/Superintendent Despa Fitzgerald

- Apologies from Superintendent Freudenstein who is on Annual Leave
- NSW Police is going through a Re-Engineering process. Redfern Local Area Command will continue to stand alone and not amalgamate. A good outcome for the Command
- The NSW Police Central Met Region Assistant Commissioner is Mark Walton who was a past Commander at Redfern
- Staffing increase in our Domestic Violence Unit
- Proactive Unit will merge with the Drug Unit to target the drug activity in the area. Redfern No1 in the state for Heroin detection, 3rd for Methylamphetamine (ICE) and Cocaine. Redfern Strike Force successful with multiple supply charges. Information from community through Crime Stoppers is extremely valued by police.
- Robberies committed by Youth some offenders are from out of our area
- Police held meeting with the Settlement, PCYC and the Fact Tree to discuss strategies for youth offenders. The Settlement has a Youth basketball team that requires sponsorship to compete at the NCIE
- Operation Cobblestone successful Tasking with High Visibility Patrols around the main business areas deters anti-social behaviour, drug and alcohol use and retail theft
- Operation Prevent continuing with patrols around NSW Department of Housing properties
- Redfern Local Area Command received the NSW Police Mystery Shopper Award for Excellent Customer Service
- Miranda Program A service in Chippendale will support women engaged in the Justice System and assist in their transition into the community. Miranda Program are recruiting an Aboriginal Caseworker
- Never Going Back program is in the process of extending the program to female inmates
- A/Superintendent Fitzgerald has been invited to join the Corrective Services Woman's Advisory Council.

7. GENERAL BUSINESS

Geoff Turnbull – REDWatch – Inner Sydney Voice Magazine has a special edition on Waterloo Public Housing Redevelopment. Publication has been well received. Systemic problems need to be identified. High needs tenants need sufficient support services. Encourages Police to keep traffic and disaster management on their agendas (with this project). Gentrification has pushed out Aboriginal families. Hope to see viable Aboriginal community.

Michael Shreenan – Counterpoint. Attended Health Forum at NCIE. New Health Worker. Concerned about drinkers at Poets Corner. Two events, Redfern Neighbourhood Day 27th Nov 2017 at Poets Corner and Summer on the Green 2nd Feb 2018 at Waterloo Green. Ongoing issues still not resolved at 125 George St Redfern - has been raised several times with different agencies. Agencies need to be more creative/proactive in addressing the concerns. A tenancy issues. No concierge. Some tenants allowing others in. Requires joint operation with services and tenants.

Redfern Police advised they are aware and liaising with residents and agencies, spending a lot of resources, responding, conducting various operations including PREVENT, attending with agencies removing unauthorised persons and HNSW issuing Banning Notices.

Judy Pearson – Drug Health. Nurse Practitioner available at Youthblock and Weave. Andrea Stone, specialist in Drug Health is also available. Event I Waterloo was a lovely event-annual event held during Mental Health Month. Lots of creative and talented young people attended.

Lyn Taylor – Alexandria Resident. Waiting for signage in Copeland Lane to address traffic concerns.

Alistair Brockley – City of Sydney. Safety audit completed. Feedback will be given at next meeting.

Christopher Blackwell – Tenant Waterloo

Thanked Redfern Police for addressing the anti-social behaviour on Cope & Raglan Street, Waterloo. Significant decrease.

Ashan Ponniah – Community Corrections. Will have increased staffing. Sentencing reforms next year. More action for Domestic Violence Offenders - prison or orders. Will be a rise in home detention. Continuing Case Management to reduce re offending. Connecting more with services.

David Belic – St George Community Housing. No Managing all 41 Morehead Street. Some positive progress.

Mary Lynne Pidcock – Business Chambers Forming alliance. Reduction in funding. Taking an advocacy role, identifying events, cutting down on duplication.
