Political Affiliations Policy Statement

All members of the NSW Police Force (police officers and administrative employees) have the right to engage in political expression, affiliation and activities, including standing as a political candidate.

With these rights comes the responsibility to ensure that:

- any personal political interests or activities engaged in by the member do not conflict with their duties
- personal political interests or comments are undertaken or expressed in a strictly private capacity and are not attributed to the NSW Police Force
- if standing as a political candidate, a member must not use their position within the NSW Police Force to unduly influence voters
- community expectations of members of the NSW Police Force to act fairly, efficiently, without bias and with integrity when performing their duties are upheld
- the government of the day maintains confidence in the impartiality of the actions undertaken and advice given by members of the NSW Police Force
- NSW Police Force resources are not used for the purposes of private political activity.

Our commitment is to ensure that all NSW Police Force members:

- do not release NSW Police Force information to political figures or candidates in the course of their duties without proper authorisation
- do not engage in party politics while on duty, with personal political activity always being undertaken in a strictly private capacity, clearly separate from their position as a member of the NSW Police Force
- do not wear police uniform, including badges and nameplates, when undertaking political activities of any kind
- do not use police equipment or facilities for carrying out personal political activities
- do not display politically sensitive material on or from NSW Police Force premises, vehicles or equipment
- do not present personal political comments or comments made on behalf of a union / association as being made on behalf of the NSW Police Force
- report any actual, potential or perceived conflicts of interest in relation to their political affiliations
- are aware of the procedures to be undertaken when standing as a political candidate
- are aware that a failure to follow this policy and the related *Political Affiliations Guidelines* may result in management action.

Responsibilities:

- Senior executive approve and support this policy statement; regularly monitor and review the policy statement; and support a culture that achieves the required outcome of this policy statement.
- Professional Standards Command regularly monitors and improves this policy statement.
- **Commanders/managers** communicate, manage and achieve compliance with this policy statement within their command by identifying risks and obligations; developing controls; monitoring effectiveness of controls; reporting breaches; and attesting to the effectiveness of command compliance/adherence.
- All staff know and comply with this policy statement and promptly report any breaches to management.
