Neighbourhood Watch is working towards a safer community attitude within your area. It will help:

- reduce crime in your local area
- improve communication between yourself, police and your community
- deter criminal activity by increasing the probability of apprehension
- encourage the reporting of crime and suspicious activity to police

- assist police to improve and maintain the level of personal safety and household security within your local area

Assist identification of recovered, lost or stolen property by:

- encouraging people to etch or engrave their driver's licence number on all items of value
- keeping a record of model and serial numbers of items of value
- keeping photographic records of jewellery, paintings, etc.
