





BACKGROUND

Deputy Commissioner Catherine Burn has been invited to attend the World Summit on counter terrorism 2015 Herzliya, Israel to attend a counter Terrorism Conference from 7 to 10 September 2015 conducted by the International Institute for Counter Terrorism (refer attached).

The International Institute for Counter Terrorism (ICT) is one of the leading academic institutes for counter-terrorism in the world, facilitating international cooperation in the global struggle against terrorism. ICT is an independent think tank providing expertise in terrorism, counter-terrorism, homeland security, threat vulnerability, risk assessment, intelligence analysis, national security and defence policy.

The ICT's 15th International Conference: World Summit on Counter-Terrorism will address the terrorism challenges currently faced by the international community. 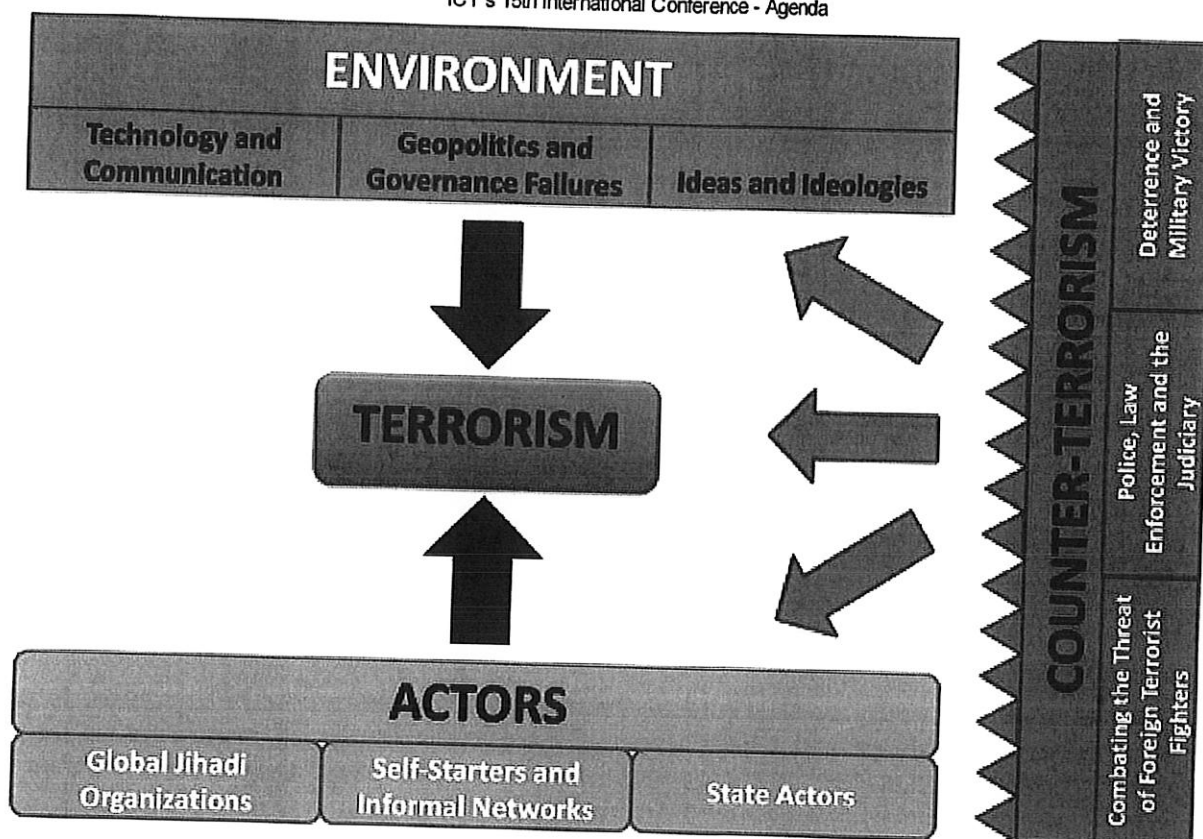
Conference Theme: Shifting Sands of Terrorism



In early 2011, when Al Qaeda emir Osama bin Laden was killed and a wave of social protests struck large parts of the Arab world, a chorus of analysts and pundits argued that global terrorism, especially of the jihadist variant, was on the path of decline.
