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Prohibited Weapons Collector Permit

This FACT sheet provides information on the requirements for obtaining a Collector Permit - clause 20 of the Weapons Prohibition Regulation 2017.

It is an offence in NSW to possess a prohibited weapon without the authority of a permit.

What does the Prohibited Weapons Collector Permit authorise?

This permit authorises the permit holder to possess prohibited weapons for the following reasons:

- For maintaining the weapons as a collection, and / or
- To display the prohibited weapons for educational, historic or commemorative purposes.

This permit does not authorise the use of any prohibited weapons.

Who can apply for this permit?

A person who is a current member of a weapon collectors society or club approved by the Commissioner of Police and who can prove they have a genuine commemorative, historical, thematic or financial collection of weapons.

There are currently four clubs approved by the Commissioner as weapon collector clubs:

- Arms & Militia Collectors Association of NSW
- Antique Arms Collectors Society of Australia
- Monaro Collectors Group
- SSAA (Mildura) Arms & Militia Collectors Guild

What is the term of the permit?

The permit will be issued for a maximum term of 5 years.

How much will the permit cost?

The prescribed fee for this permit is \$127. Your payment must accompany the application. Credit card details can be provided on the reverse of the application form.

An additional \$25 fee is required for each person, other than the permit holder, completing a P639 form to be listed and authorised by the permit.

What do I need to send with the application?

- A completed P638 'Application for a Prohibited Weapons Permit' form, and
- A completed 'Prohibited Weapon Collectors Genuine Reason' form, and
- A passport sized colour photograph endorsed on the back by a JP or police officer, and
- Supporting documentation as requested on the genuine reason form.

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What kind of prohibited weapons are authorised by this permit?

There is no restriction on the type of prohibited weapons which may be authorised by this permit. However, you must nominate the type of prohibited weapons that you wish to collect on the Genuine Reason form and you must be able to prove that the prohibited weapons forming the collection must have a genuine commemorative, historical or financial value.

Any prohibited weapon referred to in clause 1A(1) of Schedule 1 to the *Weapons Prohibition Act 1998* must be deactivated and certified by the holder of a theatrical weapons armourer permit as having being deactivated.

What safe keeping level applies to this permit?

See the FACT Sheet 'Safe Storage Prohibited Weapons Level 1, 2 & 3' & 'Prescribed Safe Storage for Schedule 1 Prohibited Weapons' for the storage level that applies to the weapons nominated for your collection.

A police officer must inspect the safe storage location and facilities where the weapons in the collection are to be stored. The COPS Event Number must be inserted in the relevant section of the genuine reason form.

Any proposed display of prohibited weapons must have prior approval by the Commander, Firearms Registry.

How do I apply for a Prohibited Weapons Collector Permit?

You must complete the P638 'Application for a Prohibited Weapons Permit' form and the 'Prohibited Weapon Collector Genuine Reason' form and where applicable provide any supporting documentation.

Instructions for completing the Permit Application Form

PROHIBITED WEAPONS PERMIT APPLICATION FORM (P638)

NEW APPLICATION / REAPPLICATION

Mark the appropriate box, new application or reapplication. If you currently hold, or have previously held, a firearms licence or firearms or prohibited weapon permit, enter your licence or permit number.

SECTION A - PERMIT TYPE

From the drop-down list select the type of permit for which you are applying. If the permit is not listed in the drop-down list, enter 'Other' and describe the type of permit you require in the space provided.

SECTION B - NOMINATED PERSON / PERMIT HOLDER

Insert the full name, date of birth, gender, NSW drivers licence (if held), contact phone numbers, email address and supply details for the nominated person (business) or nominated permit holder (individual). If you have been known by any other names enter your alias here.

SECTION C - RESIDENTIAL ADDRESS

Insert your full residential address in this section.

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SECTION D - POSTAL ADDRESS

If the postal address is the same as the residential address, mark the box. If your postal address is different to your residential address, insert your postal address in this section.

SECTION E - BUSINESS, CLUB OR GOVERNMENT AGENCY DETAILS

If this application is being made by a Business, Club or Government Agency, complete this section and attach supporting documentation.

SECTION F - SAFEKEEPING ADDRESS OF WEAPONS

If the safekeeping address is the same as the residential address, select 'YES' in the box. If your weapon safekeeping address is different to your residential address, select 'NO' and insert the address in this section.

SECTION G - PERSONAL HISTORY

Answer each question by selecting a 'YES' or 'NO' from the drop-down list. If you answer 'YES' to any question, provide details as an attachment.

SECTION H - DECLARATION

The application must be signed and dated by the applicant.

SECTION I - FEE

The prescribed fee for a prohibited weapon permit is \$127. Your payment must accompany the application.
