Crime Presentation - by Sasko Bosevski

Main crime categories in PAC are Break & Enters, Malicious Damage, Robbery, Steal from Motor Vehicle (SFMV) and Steal from Retail Store (SFRS). Expected increase over school holidays and seasonal swings in Steal from Retail Store incidents. Police are tasked to patrol hotspots.

For month of January, most incidents occurred in Riverstone followed by Quakers Hill. Highest crime category was Malicious Damage. Incidents mainly occurred on a Friday between 2100 and 2400 hr.

■ Break and Enters – Dwelling – January

Most incidents occurred in Stanhope Gardens followed by Glenwood. Mostly occurred on a Friday. Most common time is 1800 – 2100 hrs.

■ Malicious Damage – January

Most incidents occurred in Riverstone followed by Quakers Hill. Mostly occurred on a Saturday & Sunday. Most common time is 2100 - 2400 hrs.

■ Steal from Motor Vehicle – January

Most incidents occurred in Kings Langley and Marayong. Mostly occurred on a Friday. Most common time is 1500 – 1800 hrs and 2100 - 2400.

■ Steal from Retail Store – January

Most incidents occurred in The Ponds followed by Colebee. Most common time is 1800 – 2100 hrs.

■ Robberies – January

One incident in Kellyville Ridge, Lalor Park and Riverstone. Most common time is 2100 - 2400 hrs.

PAC Overview – Detective Chief Inspector Guyatt

Crime level in area is going well. The number of incidents in the PAC has increased. Staffing levels effecting response times to incidents.

There has been a decrease in Break & Enters in January after an offender was arrested and charged. Investigators have found that the offender is related to a staff member at a bank, who has been providing the details of customers to the offender.

Police conducted a search warrant at a home in Schofields a couple of weeks ago where they discovered a hydro set up. 39 plants were located and seized. Offender from Carramar arrested and charged.

Police attached to PAC have been involved with the recent fires and floods. Since mid-January, police have been tasked to travel to the southern region of NSW to assist and this will continue until the end of the month.

Last month, Quakers Hill PAC had the most DV matters ever in a 30-day period. 232 matters which includes 70 breach AVO offences. Police conduct AVO compliance checks and attend SAM's (Safety Action Meetings) with external agencies to monitor high risk DV offenders. DV incidents require a lot of police time and resources so police aim to do the best they can form the early onset. The majority of homicides are DV related. Police utilise DVEK (Domestic Violence Evidence Kits) at incidents which allows police to record on video injuries, property damage and demeanour of those involved at the scene. This adds more weight of evidence when the matter is heard at court. Angela – Please let DVLO know that there DV specialist services available at Riverstone Neighbourhood Centre if required for victims

Steal from Motor Vehicle incidents – incidents are spread over the PAC. People still not locking their cars and leaving valuables in plain sight.

Crime Prevention - Senior Constable Sue Carter

Over 10,800 members in the x9 Eyewatch Groups. In three months, the reach on the Quakers Hill PAC page is 645,910,000. Fabulous tool police use to engage the community.

There has been a lot of discussion in the groups about men wearing hi- vis vests knocking on people's door and asking to inspect roofs for hail damage. Police have confirmed that they are a legitimate business but police recommend residents obtain 3 separate quotes themselves for any works that need to be carried out at the home.

There was a serious motor vehicle and pedestrian accident involving a teenage boy on Burdekin Rd, Quakers Hill last Friday. Incident has rocked the Quakers Hill Facebook community, where many witnesses have expressed how traumatic it was for them to observe.

Have CCTV of traffic offenders that gets passed onto police. Have made recommendations for additional speed bumps, signage and bollards especially near child care centre and roundabout. Issues with speeding as drivers come out of Gate 2 towards Quakers Hill Parkway. University starts 2nd March.

Sue Lawrence- Riverstone Schofields Chamber of Commerce – President

Main focus is on Riverstone Masterplan. Major concerns that not enough planning has gone into proposal especially with local roads and traffic implications. Alternate solutions prior to rezoning need to be looked at. Mr Connelly working closely with Chamber.

Police – Police also have significant concerns with Masterplan at this stage

Angela Van Dyke – Riverstone Neighbourhood Centre – Chief Executive Officer

Neighbourhood Centre will be putting in a submission re- the Masterplan. Applaud Blacktown City Council in trying to revitalise Riverstone. Need to look at Disaster Management re- recent flooding. There has been some minor property damage to the centre recently. Currently running 'Wheelie Mate' program which engages men and veterans in building wheelchairs for third world countries out of recycled bike parts. Youth Service Centre opened Dec 2019 – can be hired for functions. Currently doing a recruitment drive for volunteers – contact Neighbourhood Centre if interested.

Not seeing youth gathering at the Tallawong station. Highway Patrol Unit carried out an operation in station carpark which saw good results. There has been a reduction in Steal from Motor Vehicle offences. Always a slight increase over school holidays but it has dropped now. Not young kids graffitiing train. Experienced some flooding in tunnel after recent storms.

<u>James Laird - The Ponds High School - Deputy Principal</u>

Main issue at school is traffic. 4000 children. Worst time is between 8:15am and 9:15am and school pick up time at 3pm. Primary school releasing children earlier to try and alleviate problem. Issues with cars conducting U-turns in bus bays, double parking and children riding bicycles on footpaths. Marsden Park public high school and Vineyard high school to open in future.

<u>Chantal Weir – The Ponds Neighbourhood Watch Eyewatch Group</u>

The Ponds Carols were held Dec last year. Didn't have fireworks due to fires. Mixed response received from community. Number were down. Had x1 lost child. Hope to hold again in 2020.
